


Light and looped objects become images. Noise set in motion becomes space. Staged gesture becomes performance.

As an Imagist, I create and mix live images using digital tools and (low-tech) devices close to visual art installations.

My interest in abstraction guides my work towards the use of feedback, of light and towards the link between image and sound.

I love et I do work video for its duality: raw and intimate capture of reality, as well as artificial and limitless picturality. So I approach these two faces of picture thanks to two different forms of writing: performance and film. Performance is like "real-timeassembly": an interactive language and a formalisme based on image, signal and light processing. Film, broadcast in an installation as a "spatialised montage": « filmstableaux » (an electronic and temporalized picture) and « filmconcrets », fragments of innocuous reality linked together.

Active member of the artistic collectif **L e M a T r i C e . . .** Several visual works are presented by VisualContainer (Milan) in many European festivals.

He is a lecturer in computer music at université Lumière Lyon2 (Music department) and creator-director of the professional master MAAAV (Musiques Appliquées Aux Arts Visuels).

Technical spec.

- 1 dark room
- 1 projection screen (at least 4 x 3 m), 1 smaller screen on feets (like a slide screen)

- 1 beamer (adapted to the room) with VGA plugs on stage
- 2 large tables (about 1,50x0,80m), with black clothes
- quality stereo sound system, 2 DI box on stage accepting 2 mono ø 6,35mm jacks
- 1 subwoofer
- 2 main plugs on stage 220V 16 A
- installation: 3h, small rehearsal: between 1 and 2h
